The Ohio Department of Public Safety funds the Human Trafficking Task Force of Ohio to develop and implement a statewide strategy to build the capacity of the state's juvenile justice and child welfare systems to identify and serve minor and youth victims of human trafficking.

For their Improving Outcomes program, Ohio identified a need to develop a unified strategy to train professionals and increase child welfare capacity in the state.

Building multidisciplinary response

Ohio utilizes a multidisciplinary approach at both the state and local level. The juvenile justice human trafficking coordinator leverages and cultivates multidisciplinary partnerships between the state juvenile justice system and community-

based providers. County juvenile courts have been able to develop robust multidisciplenaary teams with notable buy-in from important

Success by the numbers

The Ohio team has hit a variety of impressive metrics since the implementation of this project. To date, this OVC-funded project has identified and served 125 child victims of human trafficking via state juvenile correctional facilities and 2 Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services-funded juvenile court programs, trained 1,171 childserving professionals on identifying and responding to human trafficking, and led to 2 federal indictments of child sex traffickers.
